Also on the welcoming end were a number of enthusiastic and talented volunteers that included the Committee (Doug, Tina, Tom, Veronique and Cyndi), Workshop Leads (Karen, Claudie, Adrianna, Stephan, Dave, Shelley, and Lisa, and most of the Committee members) and support volunteers (George, Rigel, Leo, Helene, and 2 host school students).

Morning Workshops were created to help students understand:

- how to read the challenges
- the variety of uses for materials in an Instant Challenge

IMPORTANT Tournament Information Announcements

- Due to Site Restrictions at some of our Tournament Venue, this year it has been decided that **NO DRY ICE** will be allowed at our Ontario tournament this year. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Due to the risk of Serious Allergic Reactions <u>NO LATEX BALLOONS OR GLOVES</u> will be allowed at our Ontario Tournament Site.

FIVE IMPORTANT Things that Need to be Completed for ALL Teams

- TEAM REGISTRATION on DI Website to obtain your Team Number:
 Most teams have already purchased their team number, but if you have not already done so, please see our September 2019 newsletter for instructions.
- 2. <u>SELECT YOUR TEAM CHALLENGE:</u> It is <u>VERY important that you log back into the RESOURCE Area of the main DI website & select which Challenge your team has chosen.</u> This information is absolutely essential to our tournament team to ensure that your team is scheduled for the correct Challenge for our upcoming tournament! https://resources.destinationimagination.org/resources.php
- 3. YOUTH PROTECTION POLICY: An important reminder that All Team Managers & Team Volunteers in Ontario who work directly with DI Team Members will be required to have a Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC). If you have not already done so, Please send your Vulnerable Sector Check documentation to us at gta@diontario.org as soon as possible. If you have this documentation as part of your employment or volunteer status with your school, you MUST STILL PROVIDE US WITH DOCUMENTATION of this.

EASTERN ONTARIO REGION Team Managers & Team Volunteers: If you are attending the PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENT please send your VSC to eor@diontario.org by January 20th.

4. APPRAISER/VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION on DI Ontario Website:

Each team MUST PROVIDE THE NAME AND EMAIL OF AT LEAST ONE VOLUNTEER that can devote a minimum of 2 hours on tournament day. You must nominate a DIFFERENT INDIVIDUAL for each team you register. 5. Register your team for our Provincial Tournament on the <u>DI Ontario website</u> - Registration will be opening soon. This year our Ontario Provincial Tournament Registration fee will be \$70.00 per team.

TEAM Development

Your first focus should be to get the kids to be comfortable with each other. A great way to do this is by borrowing some tips from the Drama folks. <u>Beat by Beat Press</u> is a great resource for **Drama Games for Kids**. Quick Tip: Before you begin your generating session, create a **Comfortable Environment**. When team members are comfortable, everyone can feel more free to unleash their creative genius and express any and all possible ideas for a Challenge solution. In addition, remind your team members that you're all there to have fun and to think of as many creative ideas as possible.

Give this Instant Challenge for ALL Levels a try!

CUP HOLDER

This is a Task-based Instant Challenge

The Challenge:

Your **TASK** is to create a structure that holds two cups as high as possible and as far apart as possible.

Time: You will have up to 5 minutes to use your IMAGINATION to create a structure and then up to 1 minute to place the cups on it for score.

Set-up: In the middle of the room are two cups and a taped square. In addition, there is a table with materials.

Procedure:

• Part One (5 minutes): Use the materials to create s structure that will hold the two cups as high as possible and as far apart as possible. You may practice placing the cups on the structure in Part One. However, in order to proceed to Part

Two, you must take the cups off the structure. You will be warned when you have one minute remaining and 30 seconds remaining in Part One.

•Part Two (1 minute): Place the cups on the structure for score. No team member may touch the structure when the cups are being placed. If you did not have a structure at the end of Part One, you may continue working on your structure in Part Two. After the structure supports the cups for ten seconds without the assistance of a team member, the Appraisers will measure the height of the cups above the table and the distance they are apart.

Materials

- 6 Straws
- 1 Sheet of Paper
- 3 Mailing Labels
- 2 Pieces of String
- 1 Envelope
- 5 Pennies
- 1 Piece of Foil
- 2 Paper Clips
- 2 Chenille Sticks (Pipe Cleaners)

The mailing labels mat not be attached to the floor.

Scoring:

30 points for the overall creativity of the newscast

5 points for each separate person, event, or accomplishment presented

10 points for the creativity of each separate person, event or accomplishment presented

20 points for use of props

10 point for each full minute of the presentation

20 points for teamwork
